- 7310.3 The length of the exclusion period for communicable and infectious diseases and the requirements for readmission to school are as follows:

Pediculosis - The Department of Health recognizes two methods of treatment and the period of exclusion depends upon the treatment selected.

Treatment #1 - If an insecticide powder with residual activity, such as 10% DDT, is used continuously for a period of at least three weeks, the student may be readmitted to school the day treatment is started upon certification by physician.

Treatment #2 - The "traditional" treatment. The combination of an insecticide followed by shampoo and fine-tooth combing of the hair to remove nits. With this treatment all lice and nits must be removed before readmission. The period of treatment should be from three to seven days, the Home and School Visitor will be notified.
