Helpful Tips for Course Selection**

Graduation Requirements:

- 4 English Credits
 - English 12 Career - for students entering the workforce after high school
 - English 12 College - prepares students for college level writing
 - Advanced Placement Literature - college level coursework
- 4 Math Credits (must have Algebra)
- 4 Science Credits (must have Biology)
- 4 Social Studies Credits (Must have Econ/POD or AP Government)
- One PE course each YEAR
- Health 9 & Health 11
- One FCS course
- Skills for Life (starting with class of 2029)
- Personal Finance
- 6.5 elective credits
- 27 total credits

Math Sequencing:

College Preparatory:

Algebra, Geometry, Algebra II, PreCalculus, then either AP Statistics or Calculus

Realworld Ready:

Algebra, Business Math, Accounting

Steps in Course Selection Process:

- Read this informational sheet
- Read through Course Selection Book
- Make sure you understand graduation requirements and are working toward them
- Watch Skyward Tutorial on “Entering Course Requests through Family Access”
- Pick courses you would like to take next year
 - Make sure you have read the course description
 - Make sure you understand prerequisites or stipulations to the course you’re signing up for
 - Make sure you **pick your courses accurately as this is how course offerings are determined**
 - Courses do **NOT** fill up at this point - this is how the number of courses offered is determined
 - Schedules for students are NOT built until after course selection has completed and the HS Master Schedule has been made off of course interest

Advanced Placement Courses (AP) cannot be dropped after May 29th, 2025

LUNCHES do NOT print on schedules. Lunch is not determined until a few days before school starts when the majority of schedule changes have been made. Your block 3 teacher will tell you on the first day of school which lunch you eat.

If you are selecting Tech/Chorus/Band/Publications//Materials Processing III/IV then you **MUST** pick a semester long PE/Health/Personal Finance. Course codes are designated by an “S” at the end which stands for “Semester”, other course codes have a “Q” at the end which stands for “quarter”.

If you are taking **both Band AND Chorus** you must select I404 & I405 (these are half credit each and total 1 full credit)

Incoming 9th Grade Students:

- You will need to pick Health 9 & PE course
- You will need to pick 2-3 electives (you cannot take Aquaponics until you have successfully completed another Agricultural course)
- You will need to pick English 9 or Honors English 9
- You will see some courses already selected for you
 - Skills for Life, can be taken in 9th or 10th grade
 - These courses should be Civics, Algebra, and Intro to Science
 - **Students cannot take Biology if they are enrolled in Algebra**
 - All incoming 9th grade students **MUST** take Intro to Science. Exemptions are only made when students are: Proficient or higher on 8th grade PSSA Science, Proficient or higher on 8th grade PSSA Math, Proficient or higher on Algebra Keystone Exam, Earned an A or B in 8th grade science
 - If you are currently in Algebra or Geometry you will see your next level of math listed

Incoming 10th Grade Students:

- You will need to pick English 10 or Honors English 10 - speak to your English 9 teacher if you're not sure which to pick
- You will see American Cultures already selected for you
 - You cannot pick Sociology or Psychology during course selection as they are 11th grade courses
- You will need to pick a Math and Science course (see math sequencing above, most 10th grade students take Biology) if you're not sure what to take please consult with a Math/Science teacher
- If you are considering Adams County Technical Institute in Junior/Senior years you should considering taking your FCS and doubling up in Math and/or Science
- You will need to pick a PE

Incoming 11th Grade Students:

- You will need to pick a Math, English, Science, Social Studies, and PE
 - You can take Honors English or regular English 11
 - If you are questioning which one to take please consult with Mr. Zimmerman or Mrs. Martin
 - If you are college bound you will need a minimum of Algebra II
- If you would like to get ahead on graduation requirements you can choose to double up in Math or Science or take Personal Finance - Fairfield graduation requirements are different than college entrance requirements, make sure you look at future colleges regarding their entrance requirements
- If you have not taken an FCS (Mrs. Donaldson course) now is the time to do so
- You will NOT be able to select Adams County Technical Institute courses, please select 2 other elective credits. This will be a manual schedule adjustment once we receive acceptances
- AP Courses are a commitment and cannot be dropped after May 29th, 2025

Incoming 12th Grade Students:

- You **MUST** pick an English course
 - If you end up doing Dual Enrollment English off campus, we will remove your Fairfield English from your schedule once you provide proof of enrollment
- You **MUST** pick Econ/POD or AP Gov (if you have not taken it already)
- AP Courses are a commitment and cannot be dropped after May 29th, 2025
- You **MUST** take a PE
- Finish up any courses you have not yet taken (Science, Math, FCS, Personal Finance etc)
- Make sure you have met all graduation requirements (listed above)
- You should pick the appropriate Adams County Technical Institute level II course if you attended as a Junior
 - Please make sure to pick a semester long PE course (course code will have an S on the end)
- **PIAA athletes must have a minimum of four credits**
