JUNE HABIT TRACKER



The number 'JUNE' is formed by the following boxes and numbers:

- J:** A vertical column of boxes containing numbers 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, and 7.
- U:** A U-shaped structure with boxes containing numbers 8, 9, 10, 11, 12, 13, 14, and 15.
- N:** A structure with boxes containing numbers 16, 17, 18, 19, 20, 21, 22, and 23.
- E:** A structure with boxes containing numbers 24, 25, 26, 27, 28, 29, and 30.
